Churches of the Protestant religion were part of their community centers: the first established was Jeremiah Methodist Church in the mid-1870s in Halifax County. Haliwa-Saponi - History - Nineteenth Century The Saponi Indians were a small Siouan tribe of Virginia, allies of the Tutelo tribe. Their language was never well recorded, but was clearly closely related to Tutelo and may have been a dialect of the

same language. After colonization, the Saponis were devastated by European diseases and warfare, and merged together with other tribes.
